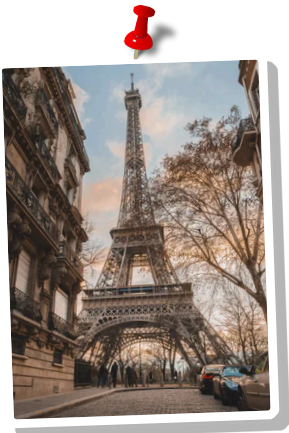
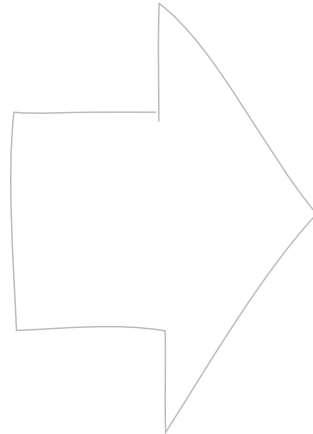

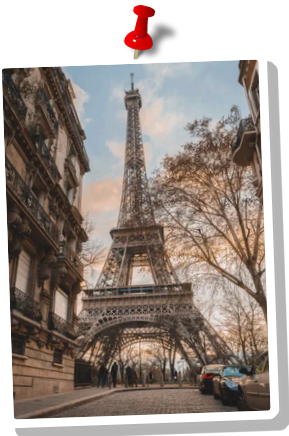
Did you know?

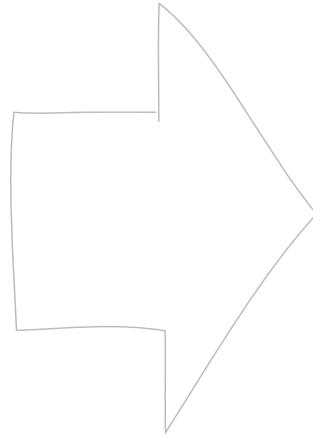
